The Governing Body recognises the valuable contribution that a wide range of additional activities and experiences can make towards pupils' personal and social education. The Governors aim to promote and provide such activities, both as part of a broad and balanced curriculum for the pupils in the schools, and as additional optional activities.

All education during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the National Curriculum with the exception of individual or group music tuition.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

When organising school trips, events or visits* which enrich the curriculum and educational experience of the children, the school invites parents to contribute to the cost of the trip. All contributions are voluntary. Parents are able to pay for trips and visits in instalments. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, we may cancel a trip. Sometimes, the school pays some additional costs in order to support the visit. Parents have a right to know how each trip is funded. The school provides this information on request.

The following is a list of additional activities organised by the school, which require voluntary contributions from parents. This list is not exhaustive:

- Visits
- Outdoor adventure activities
- Some clubs, such as Cookery
- Musical events

NURSERY

In our Foundation phase classes, parents pay a contribution (currently £1.50) each week towards the cost of fruit and vegetable snacks for the children. The children help prepare their snacks and enjoy eating them together.

RESIDENTIAL VISITS

If the school organises a residential visit in school time or mainly school time, which is to provide education directly related to the National Curriculum, we request a voluntary contribution for the education board and lodging and travel expenses. Children in receipt of free meals will be supported in covering the residential costs and transport costs through a school supplement.

MUSIC TUITION

All children study music as part of the normal school curriculum. There is a charge for individual or group music tuition if this is not part of the National Curriculum. The peripatetic music teachers teach individual or small group lessons. RCT Music make a charge for these lessons. Where possible we give parents information about additional music tuition at the end of each academic year in readiness for the forthcoming academic year.

SWIMMING

The school organises swimming lessons for all children in Year 3 to Year 6. These take place in school time and are part of the National Curriculum. We inform parents when these lessons are to take place, and we ask parents for written permission for their child to take part in swimming lessons. There is no cost to these sessions which are fully funded by the school.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Parents have the option to purchase school photographs. Payment is collected by the school and all banking and administration is undertaken by the company taking the photographs. The school receives a commission which is put into the school budget and used to purchase additional resources for the school.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

The school offers additional activities after school. These activities are run on a voluntary basis and are usually provided without charge. There may be occasions where a voluntary contribution is needed to cover additional activities provided by external organisations.

LOST OR DAMAGED PROPERTY

Parents may be asked to pay the replacement costs of any school property or equipment which is lost or damaged by a pupil.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES
